BACKGROUND

The Hertfordshire and West Essex (HWE) Shared Care Record began a phased rollout in October 2021 and now brings together selected information from the electronic records held by:

- GP practices in Hertfordshire and West Essex
- Central London Community Healthcare NHS Trust
- Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust
- Peace Hospice Care and The Hospice of St Frances
- Hertfordshire County Council
- HUC (Out of Hours)
- Princess Alexandra Hospital NHS Trust
- East and North Herts NHS Trust
- West Herts Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust
- Hertfordshire Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust (HPFT)

The Shared Care Record is also connected to receive information from acute trusts and GP practices who are part of the [London Care Record](#).

MENTAL HEALTH AND SPECIALIST LEARNING DISABILITY SERVICES INFORMATION AVAILABLE

Mental health and specialist learning disabilities services information from Hertfordshire Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust (HPFT) is now available to staff in all partner organisations using the HWE Shared Care Record.

The following information will be included for adults and children receiving care from HPFT (excluding IAPT services):

- **Demographics** - such as name, date of birth and address.
- **Diagnosis / condition** - including date of diagnosis
- **Referrals** - open referrals only with details of referring organisation and named team within HPFT
- **Appointments** - future appointments only with named team/department
- **Visits** - details of any active/previous inpatient stays

As with all partner organisations, the information provided is not the full record for an individual. Users should only access items that are needed to deliver the direct care they are responsible for and a full audit trail of access is maintained.

HOW INFORMATION IS DISPLAYED IN THE SHARED CARE RECORD

The technology used to create the Shared Care Record is called the Cerner Health Information Exchange, or HIE. Information from HPFT will populate a number of sections within the HIE with more detail displayed when you click on an entry or select 'Details' view.

Diagnoses/conditions will be shown in the 'Problem List' section.

Information from other organisations that send mental health information to the HIE as a single report will be displayed within the 'Mental Health' section as we make further connections. For example, we expect information from Essex Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust (EPUT) to be available in the Shared Care Record by the end of January 2023.

We are able to see quickly that people are known to the adult disability teams in HCC, that their care needs have been assessed and packages of care are in place.
