Sitting with you in Uncertainty

Navigating the unknown.

Uncertainty is an unavoidable part of end-of-life carefor patients, families, and even professionals.

Questions like How much time is left? or What happens next? can weigh heavily, and while social workers (and all professionals) can't provide certainty, they can offer something just as valuable: support in navigating the unknown.

In this masterclass, we'll explore the idea of Safe Uncertainty—embracing the unknown while creating a sense of safety for those experiencing it. We'll reflect on the tensions professionals face between wanting to 'fix' things and instead sitting alongside families in their uncertainty. By doing so, we help patients, carers, and even colleagues feel more able to manage the unpredictable nature of palliotive care.

Through discussion and shared experiences, we'll consider practical ways to provide this kind of support, making space for difficult emotions while fostering resilience.

An End-of-Life Study Session is being held at Robertson House on 19th May. The morning session will be for Residential & Nursing Settings and the afternoon for Homecare Settings.

The sessions aim to support care providers to ensure they are delivering compassionate and effective end- of -life care. Supporting staff to ensure they can handle the practical and emotional challenges of end-of-life care, will ensure comfort is given, while honouring of the patient's wishes, provide emotional support, and know the right actions to take are crucial for the best care.

This session for Managers, Deputies, Unit Leads, Team Leaders and Compliance leads, will focus on roles and responsibilities within all care services to meet current best practice.

The session will focus on day-to-day care including;

- Importance of Advance Care Planning (ACP)
- Delivering Good End-of-Life Care, key considerations, factors that make a good death, and communication.
- Myth Busting, addressing misconceptions and clarifying terms.
- End of life Care Documents, essential documents and legal aspects.
- Roles and Responsibilities, guidance on providing and evidencing care, including ReSPECT forms.
- Support and Decision Making, resources and information sharing.
- Supporting Staff, strategies for staff support and emotional impact.
- Scenario-Based Training, Real-life scenarios and applying ACP principles.
- Collaborative Working, Partnering with hospices and enhancing education.
